

### A Message from Fr. Frank

Dear Friends and Benefactors,

n April 22, 2005 at the Chapel of Infant Jesus, over 750 people gathered to celebrate the 25th Anniversary of Hope House Ministries. It is hard to believe that twenty-five years have passed.

It seems just like yesterday we were fixing up the Guest House at Little Portion Friary as the first Hope House. We had 10 beds then. I did not have a clue of where we were going or what ultimately we would be doing.

What I did know is God was asking me to think and act outside the box – and assuring me that he would not abandon us. He didn't! Our twenty-five year history of service and ministry is a powerful testament that God did not abandon us. To the contrary, he empowered us to become a dynamic voice for the voiceless and to be a powerful sign of hope for those on the edge of despair. The rest is history!

Never did I think that this adventure would take me to the places it has, nor did I think I would have seen all that I have seen. There have been peaks and valleys – but always a feeling of hope, no matter how desperate things at times became.

As I look back on this odyssey, I do not regret one minute of the journey – or the countless thousands that have touched my life and crossed my path. It is with a profound sense of gratitude and honor that I look upon this adventure. At times I humbly believe I have gotten more than I have given.

The greatest gift I received that night was standing among hundreds of people who sat in that very Chapel twenty-five years earlier that came that Friday to pray and celebrate. To know that they had walked with us a distance of twenty-five years was amazing.

The most overwhelming aspect of the Anniversary Celebration was to see a young man travel from as far away as Chicago, Illinois, to pray with us, as well as the young men – who are now grown men with their wives and children – with tears streaming down their cheeks as they greeted one another.

The miracle of Hope House Ministries is not my vision come true or the thousands of broken lives we have helped to heal, but rather the countless hand and hearts that have blessed this ministry for more than a quarter of a century. It is truly a ministry blessed by God.

In late March someone came into the Counseling Center for services. I stopped to help her and she said so simply, but yet so profoundly, "This is a holy place." As I thought about her comment, I said to myself she is right.

Every day broken and wounded people of all ages and walks of life come across our threshold seeking "something." They are met with compassion and the fundamental belief that "all life is sacred" and thus treated accordingly.

As we formally begin our Twenty-Fifth Anniversary Year, thanks seem so inadequate to express my profound gratitude for all that you do everyday to bless our Ministry. Almost 400 people volunteer on a regular basis, sharing their time and talent with people that often feel discarded and hopeless. We will never know the full impact that each of you have had on so many.

Be assured of my continued prayers at our daily Eucharist for you and your families. Pray that God will continue to bless us with the hands, hearts and treasure that we need to continue our mission.

### A Project Hope Anecdote

**Project Hope** is a newly formed homeless intervention dropin shelter. This program has been generously funded by the New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance and has served over 70 people since 2004.

"I am 50 years old, I have no family, no job and no hope for myself because of my 30 years of alcohol and drug addiction." This was Jim's self perception over two and a half years ago when he sat slumped and dispirited. But today Jim is sober, has a great sponsor, is involved in Alcoholic Anonymous, is employed, has been able to reconnect with his family and above all, has found a renewed sense of hope and dignity. According to Jim, "everyday is a miracle." When asked what brought about this transformation, which enabled him to change his life around, Jim's response was, "the hope and encouragement which I received from the homeless advocate when I was homeless."

Jim's story is representative of many of the homeless men and women who come to Project Hope. So often, a sense of hopelessness can become a paralyzing experience for those who have become homeless. Project Hope may be able to meet their material needs but sometimes the most important gift our homeless guests can receive is a sense of hope. As a result, Project Hope attempts to reach out to our guests in order to offer them a way out of their difficult and sometimes seemingly hopeless situation.

Since its beginning in October 2004, Project Hope has had the privilege of assisting other homeless guests like Jim to recapture their dignity in order to feel better about themselves. For Jim, his miracle started when he sought treatment for his addiction, for another it may be complying with her medication regimen, for another it may mean applying for welfare assistance or finding employment to name a few. Project Hope's aim is to continue to provide our guests with an environment whereby over time they will be able to discover or to rediscover a sense of self worth in order to move beyond their hopelessness. Consequently, Project Hope seeks to assist and to challenge our guests so they may be able to experience miracles in their lives.
